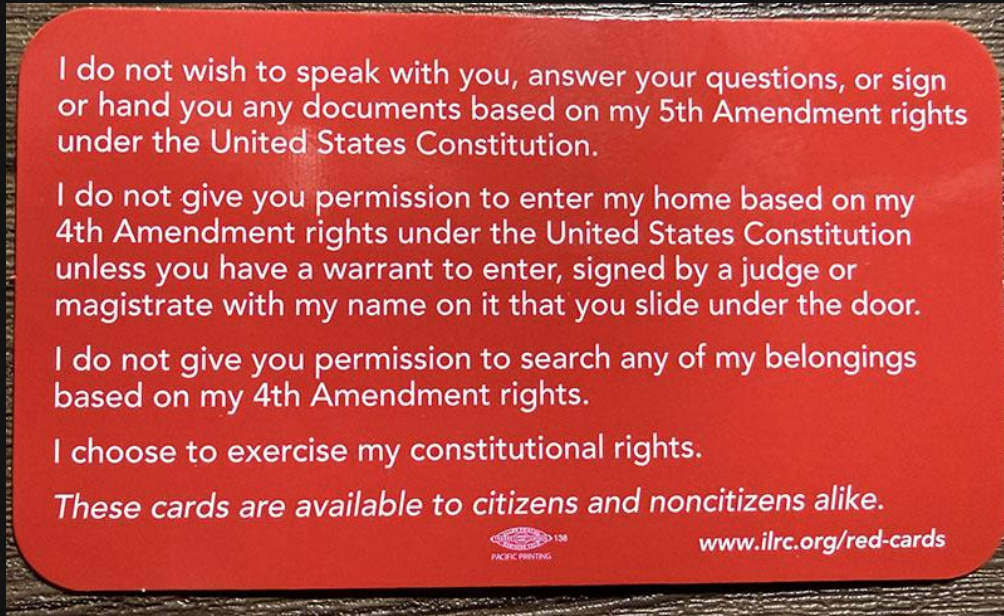


Update on the "ICE Out for Good" rally

I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, or sign or hand you any documents based on my 5th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution.

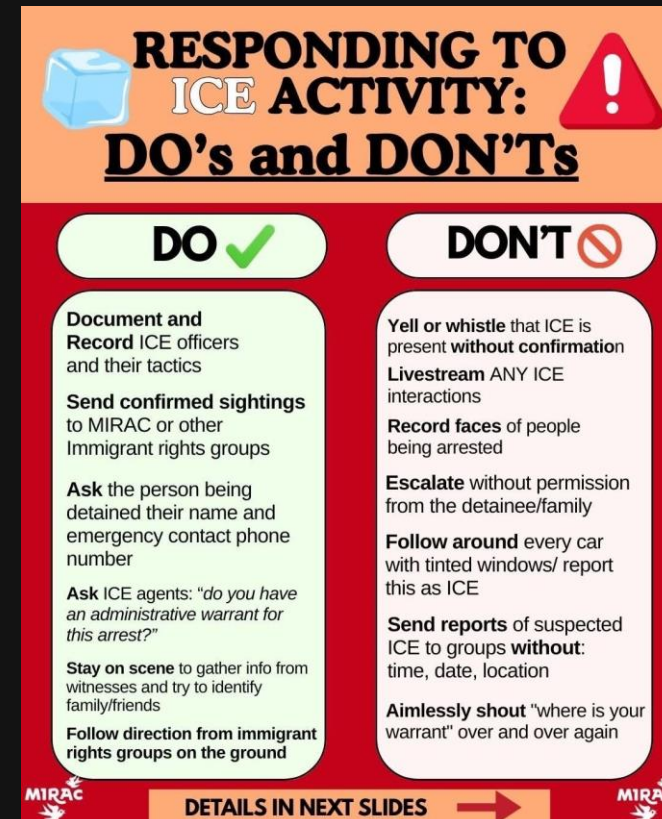

I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights.

I choose to exercise my constitutional rights.

RESPONDING TO ICE ACTIVITY:

DO's and DON'Ts

DO 	DON'T 
Document and Record ICE officers and their tactics	Yell or whistle that ICE is present without confirmation
Send confirmed sightings to MIRAC or other Immigrant rights groups	Livestream ANY ICE interactions
Ask the person being detained their name and emergency contact phone number	Record faces of people being arrested
Ask ICE agents: "do you have an administrative warrant for this arrest?"	Escalate without permission from the detainee/family
Stay on scene to gather info from witnesses and try to identify family/friends	Follow around every car with tinted windows/ report this as ICE
Follow direction from immigrant rights groups on the ground	Send reports of suspected ICE to groups without time, date, location
	Aimlessly shout "where is your warrant" over and over again

Community Outreach and Liaison(s)

Community Liaison Coordinator:

Establish regular communication and coordinate actions with groups such as UCC, UUFN, ISAIAH, Democracy Defenders, and other local community organizations. Facilitate monthly coalition meetings to ensure alignment and cooperative planning.

Interfaith and Cultural Relations Coordinator:

Build partnerships with local religious, cultural, and social groups.
Promote inclusivity and diversity within the movement.

Communications and Social Media

Communications Director:

Lead messaging strategy, press releases, and media outreach.

Oversee crisis communication and rapid-response messaging.

Social Media Manager

Manage digital platforms, disseminate event updates, campaign information, and engage community online.
Track analytics to refine outreach and engagement strategies.

Training and New Members
